Sermon Notes

1. There's _____ to our Creator in the form of worship from everyone.

When the prophet Isaiah saw God on his throne in a vision, he immediately fell down and exclaimed, "Woe is me! I am ruined for I am a man of unclean lips." In Jesus Christ, we are no longer afraid of God, and we now fall down not in fear, but in praise because we have been forgiven and given lives anew. Our worship is not merely form, but substance as well. What is the reason you worship?

2. There's _____ to Creation for insight into the relationships we have with one another, and it affirms Scripture as a foundation for basing our lives.

With many things and especially with our faith, we need to know the fundamentals. For the Christian (and for most Christians historically), that's based upon the Bible and the history that we see unfold and recorded in the Old and New Testaments. In what ways are you building up your foundation and is it enough?

3. There's _____ to the world that brings the Savior into each person's own realities.

When we go to church we're testifying to the world and to all who enter into our church community. The things that we believe, the attitude of submission to Jesus in our decisions and behaviors, show the world that we are different to make a difference. It's all Jesus, and not us. It's "not my will, but yours be done" lived out. Do you live substantially for the Lord? In what areas do we need to know Jesus more?
